Mango offers conversational language learning in over twenty languages, including:

In addition, Mango includes numerous ESL language courses, among them:

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The Rike Library now offers the Mango Languages online language learning system.

Mango is free for all library patrons, and can be accessed over the Internet from home or office as well as at the library.

To use Mango Languages:

1. Visit our website: www.rikelibrary.com

Click on the **Catalog** link and sign in using your patron ID and password.

Click on the **Mango Languages** link at the bottom of the catalog screen and continue to the Mango Languages Site.

2. Create a login and Password (optional, but required for ipod/ iphone/ ipad app)

On the login screen, you have the option to create a login and password, which allows Mango to remember where you left off the next time you login. If you want to skip this, just click "start learning."

3. Select a Course

Choose your language and level of instruction. Basic courses are a fast and easy way to learn polite conversation. Complete courses are more in-depth.

4. Access Mango

Once you've selected a course, Mango will confirm your browser's compatibility, load your course, and the Welcome screen will display. You're ready to begin!

5. Get Talking!

Use the **Course Library** menu to choose a lesson, if this is your first time, start with Section 1, Lesson 1.

Use the **Arrow Buttons** to go forward and backward through the course.

Mouse over words to see their **phonetic spellings**, and click them to hear a slower, more **articulate pronunciation**.

Click the **Fluency Button** to hear a word pronounced at normal speaking speed.

After the narrator reads a slide, the **Voice Comparison Button** will appear. Click it to compare your pronunciation to that of the narrator.

Keep an eye out for **Literal Meanings, Cultural Notes, and Grammar Notes**. They'll help you communicate more effectively.
